

About curriculum plans

Edusoft curriculum plans are a vehicle for school districts to communicate the district's scope and sequence or pacing guide, and to share key information that may help teachers with teaching, reteaching, and intervening:

- Scope and sequence or pacing information that tells teachers the content areas they need to cover in a given period of time
- A schedule of assessments to measure student mastery of the material
- Available instructional resources aligned to the standards they are teaching

Creating a curriculum plan

You can create curriculum plans all at once, or in phases as part of a collaborative effort involving teachers, schools, and districts.

To create a curriculum plan:

- 1 Click the **Curriculum** tab. Click the **Curriculum Locker** link. In the Curriculum Locker, click **Create Curriculum Plan**.
- 2 Type a name for the curriculum plan and choose the folder where you want to locate it. Click **Continue**.
- 3 In the Date Range area, enter the start and the end dates for the instructional period covered by this curriculum plan.

Click these arrows to see different months.

Click a date to choose it.

- 4 In the Publish Date area, choose when to publish the curriculum plan.
 - To publish the plan today, click **Now**.
 - To publish the plan on another date, type the date or click the calendar button and choose a date.

- 5 If you wish, add an assessment schedule and assessment to the plan.

- In the Assessment Schedule area of the Create Curriculum Plan page, type a title for the assessment schedule.
- Enter the start and the end dates for the assessment schedule. You can type a date or click the calendar button and choose one.
- To add a second assessment schedule, click **Add** and enter a title and start and end dates.
- To add a benchmark assessment, click the **Add Benchmark Assessment** link. Choose an assessment and click **Continue**.
